We are a non-profit 501(c)6 representing physicians and medical students from all of the contiguous counties in Northern Ohio. On behalf of our 6,000 members and their patients who have seen and experienced the high standard of healthcare and innovation in our city, I urge you to house the Advanced Research Projects Agency for Health (ARPA-H) in Cleveland, Ohio.

Over nearly 200 years, AMCNO has witnessed many changes in Cleveland, but one aspect has remained constant: **Cleveland is a city of integral innovation in healthcare**. Cleveland researchers have consistently proven their comfort in taking risks to lead to a larger reward for their patients through their rich history of biomedical innovation. These projects have led to a myriad of novel life-saving treatments, products, and procedures including coronary artery bypass surgery, MRI guided laser treatments on previously inoperable brain tumors, and creative health care models that save the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid millions of dollars.¹ Because of this, Cleveland should house the Advanced Research Projects Agency for Health (ARPA-H).
